

DENMARK'S LARGEST JAMBOREE EVER

In the period 21 to 29 July 2012, 35,000 children and adults will get together at Jamboree Denmark 2012 in Holstebro in the western part of Denmark. They are scouts, guides and leaders from the five internationally recognised Danish scout and guide associations: the Danish Guide and Scout Association of the Danish Minority in South Slesvig, Schleswig-Holstein, Germany, the Danish Baptist Guide and Scout Association, the Green Girl Guides of Denmark, the Danish Guide and Scout Association and the YMCA Scouts in Denmark.

The Danish boys and girls will be joined by several thousand foreign scouts and guides as well as other Danes who are parents, sisters or brothers of some of the participants, members of the FDF (Danish equivalent of Boys' Brigade) or other people interested in joining a scout and guide camp.

Scouts and guides of all age groups are invited to participate. It is up to the individual scout and guide groups to determine who will participate and for how many days. Generally, however, each group will set up a single camp for all ages.

The jamboree will be like a city with neighbourhoods. There will be between four and six neighbourhoods, each composed of several housing estates. A housing estate will comprise all the scout and guide groups from the same town, city or municipality in Denmark.

The programme will consist of activities and large events. Participants will have to register for some of the activities in advance and for some of them it is possible just to show up. Altogether, the jamboree will offer so many events and activities that there will be plenty for all!

Camp registration is a two stage process – in November 2011 there is advance registration and in March 2012 there is the final registration.

The jamboree vision is that 'Jamboree Denmark 2012 offers intense moments where we meet each other, develop ourselves and change the world'. These are concepts that are repeated in the jamboree theme: 'We meet each other – we change the world – I develop myself.'

Colourful symbols constitute a jamboree code language designed especially for Jamboree Denmark 2012. They act as eye catchers and can be used both together with the jamboree logo and alone. Everybody can develop symbols from a circle encompassing a square grid of 16 dots. The dots can be highlighted by colours or connected with coloured lines.

The jamboree is managed by the Jamboree Executive Committee and 12 committees, and a number of teams for each committee. The committees are set up according to the responsibilities required to plan and organise Denmark's largest jamboree ever.

Policies and principles will form the 'code of conduct' for Jamboree Denmark 2012. A camp that joins together five different scout and guide associations must have a set of common guidelines, and therefore the Executive Committee and the Jamboree Supervisory Board have, among other things, laid down principles on spiritual contemplation.
